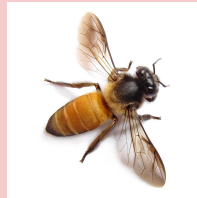
Sammamish Stewards Projects 2019-2020 (con't)

Native Plant Salvage - Sharon Steinbis and Steve Marple

Goal: To create a robust process that is tied to the city's plat application, which developers fill out.

Upcoming salvages:

- Nov. 9 at Big Rock site B. Caretaker home garden, with Sammamish Botanical Garden Society.
- Potential spring salvage near ESP, for new steward projects.
- Site near Beaver Lake Preserve with 20, 5-7' Doug firs.



Native plant nursery - Steve Marple lead w/ Stewards' assistance

Nursery is located at Beaver Lake Park maintenance area. Stewards help with watering, weeding, bleaching of pots, and potting up plants.
